

## Language Challenges!

Go on a scavenger hunt. Find 3 things that are: tiny, large, bumpy, smooth, and loud.	<b>Play a game.</b> Sit down to play a game together. Have fun!	Clean up! Clean the house together. Label the actions you do and the tools you use!	Head to toe. Starting at your head and working down to your toes, label all of your body parts!	Please complete as many of the challenges as possible with your child this month. Cross off the box after you've completed it. And remember that the most important work you'll do with your child during this time is playing with them, talking with them, and engaging with them.
Make a snack. Talk about the ingredients you add and the actions you do (mix, pour, bake).	<b>Animals!</b> Think of an animal. Describe it in 3 different ways. (Ex: has fur, meows, small).	Draw a picture. Draw a picture and have your child describe what they're drawing to you.	Describe the weather. Is it hot? Cold? Rainy? Dry? Talk about what you like and don't like.	
Watch a show! After watching, talk about it. What happened? How did they feel?	Laundry time! Fold the laundry together. Label the types of clothes and their parts (ex: sleeve)	<b>Go on a nature</b> walk. Point to, name, and describe what you see and hear!	Wash your hands! While washing your hands, talk about what you're doing!	
Play "I Spy". Play I Spy. Describe an item in the room and have your child guess what it is.	Move your body! Do different actions (jumping, jumping jacks, crawling, rolling) & talk about it.	<b>Read a book.</b> Read a book together and talk about the pictures!	<b>Opposites.</b> What's the opposite of fast? Full? Easy? Dirty? Big?	
<b>I'm thankful for</b> Sit down together and name 5 things you're thankful for.	<b>Star gaze.</b> Go outside at night and look up at the stars and the moon!	Play Simon Says. Give silly, fun directions for your child to follow!	Play, play, play! Sit down and play together for 20+ minutes. Talk about what you're doing!	SPEECHY musings
