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IEP vs 504

An Individualized Education Program (IEP) is a written plan of services for the education of students who are disabled or gifted.

Must meet two criteria for an IEP:

1. One of the qualifying 13 disability categories defined by the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) and
2. Must need special education, specially designed instruction to receive educational benefit.

IEP vs 504

A 504 plan will provide services for a child with a disability that is shown to substantially limit his or her educational performance. This includes physical or mental impairment that substantially limits major life activities.

Evaluations

When there is a concern with a child's academics, behaviors and or both, an evaluation for special education will determine if a child has a disability and needs specialized instruction and support.

Seizure Action Plan

A Seizure Action Plan (SAP) contains tailored guidelines on how to respond during a seizure, based on the patient's medical history.

Seizure Emergency Plan contains tailored guidelines on how to respond to prolonged seizures (status epilepticus) and/or seizure clusters, which may need to be stopped with emergency intervention.
